In 1989, Sister Mary and Joan Dawson McConnon co-founded Project H.O.M.E. Since that time, Project H.O.M.E. has grown tremendously - now offering 459 units of housing in Philadelphia, including 272 units of supportive housing.

Project H.O.M.E. also has increased its efforts to address the structural causes of homelessness and poverty through neighborhood revitalization in North Philadelphia. This initiative includes Economic Development along Ridge Avenue, a Community-Based Health Center, a Homeownership Program and the Honickman Learning Center and Comcast Technology Labs – a state-of-the-art technology center that provides educational and workforce development opportunities for neighborhood children and families.

In 2002, Joan, along with Sister Mary, received the prestigious “Leadership for a Changing World” award from the Ford Foundation. In September 2007, Joan, along with Sister Mary, was listed among the “75 Greatest Living Philadelphians” in the *Philadelphia Daily News*. Joan and Sister Mary were featured on the December 2007 cover of *Philadelphia Magazine* with Jon Bon Jovi, rock star and co-owner of Philadelphia Soul arena football and founder of Jon Bon Jovi Soul Foundation.

As a tribute to Joan’s financial expertise, Project H.O.M.E. received its fifth consecutive four-star rating from Charity Navigator in June 2008.

In May 2009, Sister Mary was honored as one of TIME 100’s most influential people.
